




Dear Parents/ Carers.



Trips

School trips and visitors help enhance the school curriculum - inspiring the children, broadening their horizons and leading to better and deeper learning. No child will ever miss out on participating on a trip; however, there was a shortfall of over £500 in voluntary donations over the last year. To put this in perspective, due to budgetary constraints as a result of cuts to funding, our entire budget for English resources last year was £300. As these events depend on additional voluntary donations, we aim to minimise the financial cost to parents but it may be the case that a trip needs to be cancelled if insufficient donations are not received.

Financial constraints on schools

There is wide spread concern about the long term impact of cuts to education funding over the next few years. All the teaching unions, the head teachers unions and UNITE have launched a campaign to persuade the government that these cuts are not sustainable and will impact on children's learning and well-being with not only staffing budgets but curriculum budgets and mental health provision affected. Within BANES, schools stand to lose £6,744,360, equivalent to 181 teachers by 2020! You can find out more information about the scale and the impact of the cuts at http://www.schoolcuts.org.uk/ .
